The CARES Surgicenter, part of Saint Peter's Healthcare System, has been ranked among the top ambulatory surgery centers in the country two years in a row by Newsweek and Statista, and provides an outstanding option for patients for elective outpatient procedures.

Surgeons opt to use the da Vinci® Surgical System for gynecologic surgeries, pancreatic conditions, esophageal procedures, gallbladder conditions, oncologic procedures, urologic procedures, and colorectal procedures.

With two da Vinci Surgical Systems in two dedicated operating rooms, Saint Peter's averages more than 600 robotic-assisted surgeries per year.
